

Acts 9: 1-22 - Saul's journey to Damascus

Every journey begins with one step but I don't think that was in Saul's mind as he set out that morning breathing threats against the followers of The Way, a group of people who were talking about Jesus in a challenging way. He was well prepared with letters of authority from the High Priest to capture any that he found, male or female and take them bound to Jerusalem.

As they approached the city suddenly a blinding shone in front of them. Saul fell to the ground and heard a voice "Saul, Saul why do you persecute me" Saul asked who are you, Lord, with a big question mark in his voice. "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting. Go into the city and you will be told what you are to do. Those who journeyed with him said nothing although they heard talking but didn't see any one.
